Optimizing photos for the web using Photoshop

- 1. **File/open**; navigate to folder where original image is.
- 2. **Modify I mage as desired**; crop, filters, rotate, brightness etc.
- 3. Modify Image Size from menu; Image/Image Size
 - o If horizontal image; 650 pixels wide
 - o If Vertical image; 500 pixels high
- 4. Optimize for the web from menu; File/Save for Web; bottom of optimize dialog box shows file type & size of optimized image. This should be jpeg for photos and around 50k in size.
- 5. To optimize from this dialog box: In the upper right hand corner choose jpeg quality no smaller than 45. If it is has too many artifacts (looks pixely) raise quality but stay under 50k in size. (try 60 quality)
- Click save; navigate to website folder/images/ and save document with simple name with no caps/no symbols/no spaces.
 ex: joefishing.jpg
- Create a Thumbnail; Modify Image Size from menu;Image/Image Size
 - Thumbnails always the same height ex:100 pixels high
- Optimize for the web from menu; File/Save for Web;
- Click save; navigate to website folder/images/ and save document with the same name as "bigger photo" but add _thumb to the end of the file name.
 - ex: joefishing_thumb.jpg
- 10. Close document without saving! You don't want to save over the original photo with the thumbnail.
